### From the Pastor's Keyboard

Dear Church Family,

Have you ever heard the term "He said, She said?" If you have not heard it you most certainly have experienced it. It is so easy to get into a disagreement with someone. What I find is so interesting, when I am counseling some couples, is that both parties almost always think they are right. While one may be more convincing, or more forceful, they both feel they are right.

When Penny and I were going through premarital counseling, we were asked to find a couple that had been married for 50 years and ask them the secret of their long marriage. We found that couple while we were standing in a lobby of a church after the service and asked them the question. The guy spoke first saying, "The reason we have been married so long is that we never fight or argue." At that he turned to talk to someone else. The wife spoke up and said, "The reason we never have a fight is because I always give in to what he wants, but I do not always agree, so I choose to always do what he wants." At that the guy turned around and said, "I thought we always agreed?" She said, "No, I just keep quiet, but I often disagree with you." They then launched into their first vocal argument.

Augments and fights happen, but the Bible says something important. In Proverbs 15:4 it says, "The soothing tongue is a tree of life, but a perverse tongue crushes the spirit." The word used for soothing means "brings healing, composure, health, remedy, soothing, and tranquility." In other words, this tongue speaks words that help stop or help bring to an end a problem. This tongue brings one back to a healthy composure. This is a tongue that speaks truth in love, but helps to bring understanding, resolve, and release to a situation.

What I have gotten out of this verse is this: Do my words bring life or death, selflessness or selfishness, condemnation or mercy, peace or war. What is often needed is words that bring opportunity for solution. I must first love in heart, then I can love in words.

I hope each of you as you experience the joy of words that bring healing.

### **Strawberry Bread**

A treat for dessert!, from Taste of Home

Ingredients:

3 c flour

2 c sugar

1 t baking soda

1 t ground cinnamon (ok, 2)

1 t salt

1 egg, plus 3 egg whites, lightly beaten

1 1/4 c vegetable oil

2 heaping cups fresh or frozen strawberries, chopped

1 1/2 c chopped walnuts

Combine dry ingredients in a large bowl. Mix egg, egg whites, and oil in a smaller bowl, then add to the dry mix and stir until well moistened. Stir in strawberries and nuts (dough will be stiff).

Pour into two 8"x4" loaf pans; bake at 350F for 70 minutes or until bread tests done. Cool in pans before removing to a wire rack. Yield 2 loaves; 32 servings.
